Volunteer Recognition

The question of how volunteers are recognised has arisen twice in recent weeks:

- 1. I received an e-mail from Richard Cronin, with an attached earlier e-mail from Tommi Grover concerning lack of JK volunteer recognition from BOF. Richard also concerned by relatively low number of NGOC volunteers at an event which was not too far from home. (Copy e-mail attached). I believe the club will eventually receive a significant payment from BOF for this event. Volunteers were rewarded by a £5 on the day voucher for helping. Should the club use the payment from BOF to fund a better reward, especially for those who helped on the day without getting a run? In the past as controller, I have received an event buff, and a T-shirt. (Both from Croeso/WOA). Something similar should have been considered for the JK. Can we do anything now?
- 2. I have received a packet of "Thank You!" postcards from BOF, relating to National Volunteer Week (1-7th June). (Electronic image attached, editable version also available). "Pre-Entries" App

An observation only: I have used this several times when entering BOK events and still find it less user-friendly than Fabian4. However, I did make a complaint to Ben Mitchell that the payment receipts showed the name of the club whose event had been entered but failed to give the event name, and he responded the same day to say that future receipts will show this information.

Forestry England Consultations

I responded to the on-line Consultation on Parkend Walk and Blakeney Hill Walk Forest Plan (and Pat Macleod also did so). The following reply was received from Stephanie Johns (Communications Officer – Our Shared Forest, Forest of Dean, Forestry England):

"Good morning. Thank you for taking the time to consult on the Parkend Walk and Blakeney Hill Walk Forest Plan. Your concerns around the proposal of zoning have been taken onboard and we would like to assure you that, because of comments made by yourself and others, we will be revisiting this internally. The aim of our 'Quiet Zone' proposal is to ensure that some areas identified as having special or sensitive flora and fauna, get the extra protection needed to thrive. That said it is clear from the comments we have received that this needs more work. Before we progress this any further and make any changes, we will be sure to reach out and engage fully with user groups. You can keep up to date with the work we are doing in the Forest of Dean through our Facebook page or on our website.

The proposed "quiet zones" in which NO organised events would be permitted do not include any areas that NGOC regularly uses, but do include the Moseley Green (Churchill Enclosure) area that we have used in the past, and the BOK area of Oakenhill Wood to its south, which were used for S. Champs in 2019.

- The new bank mandate has been accepted HSBC just didn't bother to tell me until I contacted them.
- JK. The income from our card reader was passed to British Orienteering Federation. I have received re-imbursement for our printing costs and use of our SI equipment (see above). Awaiting the final "profits".
- £700 was raised from the Chris James memorial event in Ledbury, £391 on the day and £309 in donations through Fabian4. I have paid £350 to Cancer Research and £350 to The Orienteering Foundation. From the latter "It is very kind of Chris's widow to think of the Foundation and agree for us to have half of the proceeds. We do appreciate it and please let NGOC know that it will be wisely spent by the Trustees."
- Action points pending from meeting on 7th February:
 - We are now affiliate members of the Cotswold Way Association. I have set up a standing order as the original one-off payment through PayPal was rejected. The cost is £50 p.a.
 - I followed up our Woodland Trust membership. Their records were in a mess as they had conflated Carol's personal membership with our group membership. Hopefully this is now sorted. I have been sent 3 back issues of their magazine "Broadleaf" – would anyone like to read them? The membership is £33 p.a.
- Our equipment insurer, Richard Weston, has moved the renewal date from 1st June to 1st September. I have paid £88.46 for the 3-month extension. If any changes to our cover from September are required, they need to be submitted soon.

- I have contacted Trimtex with an order for 40 new o-tops and am awaiting a quote. I am expecting the prices to have risen significantly due to inflation and the weak pound. We already sell at a loss so we may need to increase the price.
- *I have still not received an invoice from the Huntley Estate for the May Hill event, but I expect it be just under £1000. The event will have made a loss but this is more than covered by surpluses from other events.
