Role: Chair Report: April 2023

- I have failed to do anything about funding application for Coach/Development. If anybody thinks they can do a better job please volunteer?
- Prepared an initial set of Veteran Home Internationals (VHI) relay courses and submitted to Controller for agreement of concept. (Shape of long courses MWM agreed, but short courses WMW need more work).
- Devon now intends to make the Caddihoe their annual event, from 2024 onwards, but have
  withdrawn from assisting Kernow with the Tamar Triple (TT). Kernow, after discussion at their
  committee meeting of Devon's withdrawal, have decided they are unable to stage the TT
  alone, so will not be organising it in future! Kernow said the May Bank Holiday weekend
  (alternating with Springtime in Shropshire) will now be a free date in the calendar.
- The format of the chasing start on Day 2 of "our" 2023 Caddihoe (Sunday 1 October 2023) has been much discussed. Team has agreed that we will have a Chase. Controller favours a traditional chase (not our proposed hybrid). For discussion (see agenda)
- Completed updating of OCAD map of Gloucester to show several newly-constructed areas, based on OS and Google data, for urban event 13 May. Further updates likely to be necessary as planning progresses.
- The initial response from Gloucester City Council to Samuel's application form requesting permission was rather negative, but I spoke to the "Film & Events Officer" and provided a written statement giving details of how the event will operate, and we now have agreement in principle, subject to providing map of control locations and payment of £63.
- Attended SWOA virtual committee meeting 28 March.
- "Chairman's Challenge" I'm not keen on getting involved with anything too time consuming close to the time of the VHI weekend at the end of September. Previously I suggested adding two short navigational Challenges to the Middle Race at Selsley on 2<sup>nd</sup> Sep (using same controls) but maybe 2 events in 1 day not such a good idea?? And location not great for me. I understand it's likely to be last year that Maize Maze is available, so perhaps we should revert to that is Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> Sep likely to work with Maize farmer? 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Joint statement from British Orienteering and Forestry England (sent 30 March 2023)

Permissions and access to the nation's forests: joint statement from British Orienteering and Forestry England

British Orienteering and Forestry England are discussing updates to the agreement for permissions in the nation's forests because the current agreement expires in September this year.

This is a priority for both of us and Forestry England will still accept applications for competitions and activities beyond September 2023.

One of the key reasons behind the discussions is that Forestry England has, over recent years, been making permissions for all activities in the nation's forests fairer and more consistent.

As part of this, they are introducing a new system that should make applications easier to make and manage. As this develops, British Orienteering have been invited to help with a degree of user testing to refine and improve the system.

Further details will follow in due course so in the meantime, please submit your permission applications in the usual way.

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
