Report: February 2024

Christmas and the holidays feel like a long time ago now; we are already half-way through Q1 2024. Is it too late to ask ourselves what are the club's New Year Resolutions for 2024?

The club has put on six events over the first six weeks of the year – an impressive production rate.

The chair's challenge is looking feasible, thanks to Greg's efforts with landowners and the map. Parking is likely to be in an adjacent field. The intended format is an ultra-sprint. This would comprise three courses of just under 1km each. There are no control codes – mis-punches are penalised by 30 seconds added to times. The winner is the shortest cumulative time. Any handicap is TBC. Any other thoughts gratefully received.

Question #2: Do we want to add a social element to the event? If so, then I think we should pay up for some toilet facilities rather than assume club members will be happy to use nearby woodland.

I have not made progress visiting Gloucester prison at the time of writing – apologies.

Update from SWOA – January committee meeting:

At the SWOA committee meeting, the following points were raised:

- SWOA champs: potentially use the SARUM Saunter for the Longs and the BOK Bath Sprints for the Sprint event. There was extensive discussion about using the BOK Middle event on the 9th of June but ultimately it was decided that this was not possible since the expected winning times were longer than BOF guidelines so they could not legitimately be advertised as Middle Distance championships. BOK will be asked if they are prepared to shorten courses.
- Discussion about defibrillators clubs had considered it but none had progressed due to maintenance costs and a view that they were of little clinical importance if they cannot be brought to the patient in about five minutes
- There are new BOF rules Version 3.11, which are now effective, all club officials should be made aware of them.
- John Warren has retired from controlling duties after many years and SWOA wishes to record its thanks for his longstanding service to orienteering.
- Any club planning to put on a training course, or in need of a course, for event officials should contact SWOA. Grants are available for courses open to all SWOA clubs.

Finally, I would like to draw your attention to a recent missive from BOF on insurance, which is relevant to us:

Insurance

British Orienteering have increased their Association and Members Combined Liability from £10m to £15m. British Orienteering were made aware of a liability claims settlement in excess of £12,500,000 arising in the world of amateur sport recreation and entertainment. The claimant had suffered a catastrophic spinal injury. Advice from the legal representatives has indicated that this is increasingly typical for this type of head or spinal injury. With current claims inflation, increases in the cost of care these figures are expected to further increase. As a result of the review the Board have agreed to increase the liability cover from £10m to £15m with immediate effect.

Non-Members Activities & competitions

Since the introduction of insurance for non-members in competitions in January 2020 at the request of clubs, we have frequently been requested to clarify the situation for insurance for non-members at activities. Non-members are covered for **Activities** up to 3 sessions with the aim/interest in becoming a member of the club. To be covered they must be a member of British Orienteering from their 4th visit for insurance to continue to apply whilst participating in club activity. Non-members of British Orienteering are covered for all **Competitions** – providing the competition is registered and participants declared to British Orienteering.

Failure to carry out the above may invalid the insurance in the event of a claim.

Item 7 - Purchase of defibrillator: It was felt that it would be helpful to have data on the effectiveness of defibrillators in the context of orienteering events. It appears from past incident reports that defibrillators would not have made a difference. Is this still the case?

Other items to report:

- Heard from Vanessa Lawson that former member Chris Morris died just after Christmas. He was Legend editor from 1999 to 2002. Liaised with Alan Brown on the piece in January's Legend and with David May on a piece for the SLOW magazine (Chris had been a founder member of SLOW). - Attended Chris's memorial service 10th Feb. Sent a brief report to Alan.
- The new 2024 "Rules of Orienteering" are now live! My rule change request that the standard scale for urban
 maps should be 1:4,000 has been accepted. (Maps specifically drawn at 1:5,000 are still acceptable, but for
 reasons of clarity NOT maps drawn according to ISSprOM at 1:4,000 and then reduced, as most seem to have
 been!)

- Took part in the British Orienteering Major Events webinars, held on last two Monday evenings. The first
 highlighted some aspects of the new Rules. Will miss the third webinar as it clashes with this NGOC committee
 meeting, but recordings of all will be available.
- The new Rules clarify "uncrossable" and "not to be crossed" as applied to ISOM and ISSprOM maps. Wrote an explanatory piece for next Legend (checked by controller Greg).
- Made two initial visits to assess vegetation in the southeastern part of BOK's New Beechenhurst map, which we intend to borrow for a League event in a year's time.
- Organised "new-style" string course at Symonds Yat Regional. The only snag was that all the available "standard" maps showed the course west of the start/finish, but we needed the area to be east of the start/finish, so I had to draw a new map the day before. Not a difficult job! **Realistically** I don't think it would matter, as none of the runners were likely to be using a compass, but I feel that we should start them off right, with north at the top of the map! Otherwise, the new system was easy to operate, thanks Maggie.
- Helped at Cleeve Hill school training event.
- Sales of club T-shirts, O-tops and jackets have been very slow.
